Dr. Yachoui has a doctorate in General Policy and Organization's Strategies and a doctorat d'Etat in Economics from University of Paris IX-Dauphine, France. In addition he holds an Engineer degree in Industrial Engineering from Lille University-France. He is currently Professor and Dean of the Faculty of Business Administration and Economics at Notre Dame University-Louaizé. He is also member of the Board of the National Council of Scientific Research in Lebanon.
