The Role of Diaspora in Remaking Lebanon's Economy: Missed Opportunities & New Proposals & Presidential Elections

PROFILE

As Professor of Law, he has received life tenure in leading universities on three continents, first as Director of the Centre for Islamic and Middle Eastern Law at the University of London, then as EU Jean Monnet Chair for the European Commission at Saint Joseph University, and third as Presidential Professor of Politics and Law at the University of Utah. He has also taught as visiting professor at Harvard, Yale, Princeton, and other universities, and has most recently been invited as a visiting professor at Sciences Po, the most prestigious law school in France today. In his academic work, he has published over ten books in various fields in Arabic, French and English, including several reference books taught in various universities. In his international work, he has met with several world leaders, including US Presidents Carter, Bush Jr, and Biden, Iranian President Muhammad al-Khatami, and French President Francois Hollande. A few days after his election, he discussed Iraq and Lebanon with Iraqi president Dr Latif Rasheed, who visits Lebanon frequently. Mallat has given several addresses in the US Congress, the European Parliament, and the Japanese Foreign Ministry.
