Hisham Hamdan holds a Ph.D. in International Public Law from Charles University, Prague, with a dissertation on "Peacekeeping Operations under the Charter of the United Nations: The Theory and the Practice." With a distinguished career spanning decades, Dr. Hamdan has served as Lebanon's Ambassador to Mexico, Argentina, and Paraguay, leading groundbreaking diplomatic initiatives, including negotiations at the United Nations on global security, peacebuilding, and international justice. His extensive experience includes roles as Deputy Permanent Representative to the UN in New York and Geneva, Vice President of UNICEF's Executive Council, and Acting Vice President of ECOSOC. A recognized leader in multilateral diplomacy, Dr. Hamdan has lectured at prestigious institutions worldwide and published extensively on international law, peacebuilding, and sustainable development. His accolades include the San Martin Cross (Argentina), Doctoris Honoris Causa (Mexico), and over 300 honorary recognitions globally. Dr. Hamdan continues to contribute as a co-founder of the Lebanese Organization for Peacebuilding and as an active researcher, championing Lebanon's role as a model of dialogue and post-conflict peacebuilding.
